Dear Mr. Cote:

We write to express our concern regarding Honeywell's ongoing lockout of more than 400 active United Auto Workers (UAW) in Green Island, New York and South Bend, Indiana.

It has been four months since the lockout began on May 9, 2016, during which time Honeywell has hired temporary replacement workers to continue building parts that support the Air Force's F-35 and B-52 programs.

We believe that our servicemen and women deserve the highest quality parts and equipment built by a high quality workforce, and we strongly support the ongoing partnership Honeywell has enjoyed with the UAW for more than 80 years.

We were encouraged to learn that Honeywell and the UAW intend to resume negotiations on September 12, 2016. We urge both parties to negotiate in good faith and quickly end the ongoing lockout.

We will continue to monitor the negotiations carefully and look forward to a fair and timely resolution.
