BOSK workers just officially filed for a union.

An overwhelming <u>supermajority</u> of us have signed union authorization cards. We sent those cards to the NLRB to request a union election. We ask that BOSK respect our right to form our union and not attempt to delay our democratic election.

BOSK WORKERS SUPPORT FORMING A UNION BECAUSE:

- We will have a stronger voice. Collective bargaining means we will be able to negotiate over pay, benefits and working conditions, and secure those improvements in a binding contract that the company cannot change without our consent.
- We will decide what's best for us at BOSK. Once we form a union, we will elect a bargaining committee, decide what matters most to us, and bargain for those priorities.
- We're joining forces with tens of thousands of autoworkers across America. We have the opportunity to make battery worker jobs the best jobs in this country.
