THE FACTS ABOUT UNION DUES

When we start paying dues and how much will they be?

- No one pays dues until after we have bargained our first contract and voted democratically to approve it.
- UAW dues are 2.5 hours of straight-time pay per month.
- For bonuses and profit sharing, dues are 1.44% of the bonus/profit sharing.

Why are there union dues?

Big corporations and billionaires organize their money to protect themselves, pay for lawyers, and get good contracts for their businesses. Dues are a smart way for workers nationwide to organize their money to protect themselves, just like companies do. Would BOSK ever do anything without a contract to protect its business?

Dues are important because they provide the resources necessary to build and sustain a strong union and rights in the workplace. The resources help at all levels: from forming a union, to bargaining the first contract, enforcing rights under an existing contract, and providing strike benefits if we decide democratically to go on strike.
