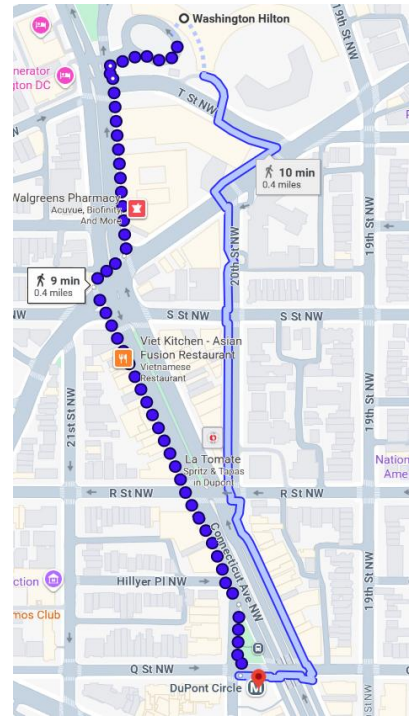


Lobby Day Transportation Guide

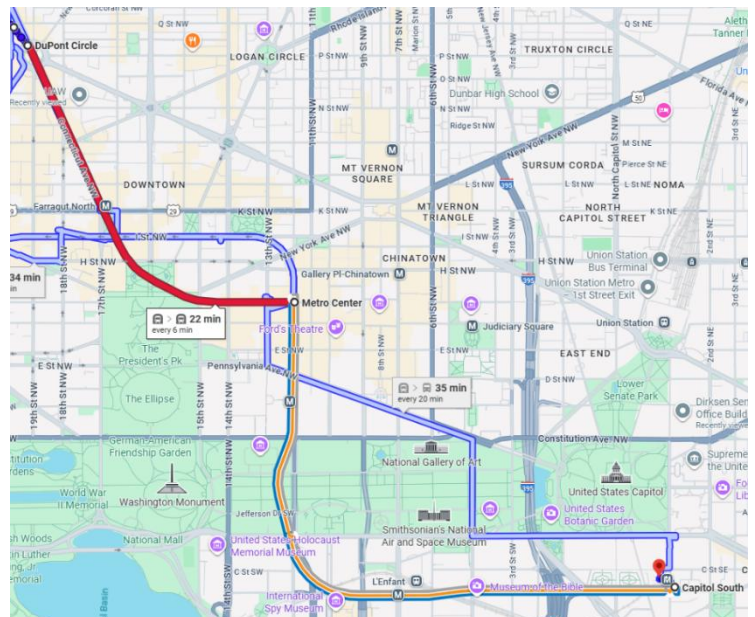
Getting to Dupont Circle Metro Station

On Tuesday, February 10, conference delegates who are participating in the UAW's lobbying efforts will leave the Washington Hilton around 11am, unless otherwise discussed with your CAP reps. If able, delegates will walk 0.4 miles to the Dupont Circle Metro Station, the closest station to the Washington Hilton. Go south on Connecticut Avenue until you reach Q St NW, where you will see the large entrance to the Dupont Circle Metro Station. There will be alternative transportation provided for those with accessibility needs.



Traveling from Dupont Circle Metro Station to the House Office Buildings

Most of the lobbying meetings with your representatives will take place in the House Office Buildings (Rayburn, Longworth, and Cannon). To get to the House Office Buildings, **take the Red line train from Dupont Circle towards Glenmont. When the train arrives at Metro Center, get off the train and follow the signs towards the Orange, Blue, and Silver lines. All of these lines go to Capitol South Metro Station. Take either the Orange line towards New Carrollton, the Blue line towards Downtown Largo, or the Silver line towards New Carrollton or Downtown Largo.**

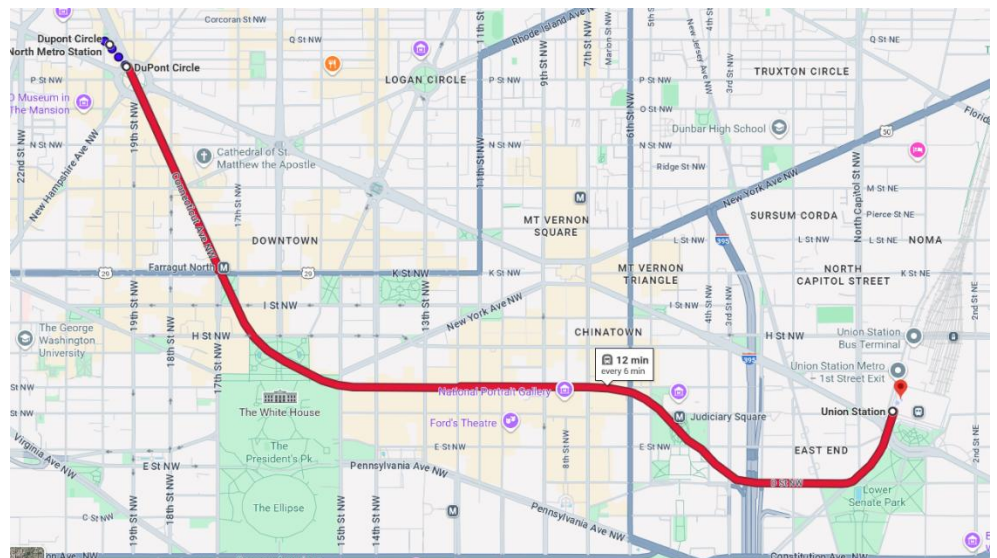


The ride, including the transfer, will take about 22 minutes. **When you arrive at Capitol South, get off the train and exit the station.** House offices are spread across three different buildings, so be sure to note which building(s) meetings are being held in. The building entrances are identified by the accessibility logo. Entrances are sometimes closed or changed to staff only, so be sure to check the signs before trying to enter. There is a tunnel that connects each building. Generally, it is located on either the ground floor or basement, but be sure to familiarize yourself with the buildings, follow the signs, and block off 15 minutes between meetings for travel.



Traveling from Dupont Circle Metro Station to the Senate Office Buildings

Meetings with Senators will take place in the Senate Office Buildings (Hart, Dirksen, and Russell). **To get to the Senate Office Buildings, take the Red line train from Dupont Circle towards Glenmont.**

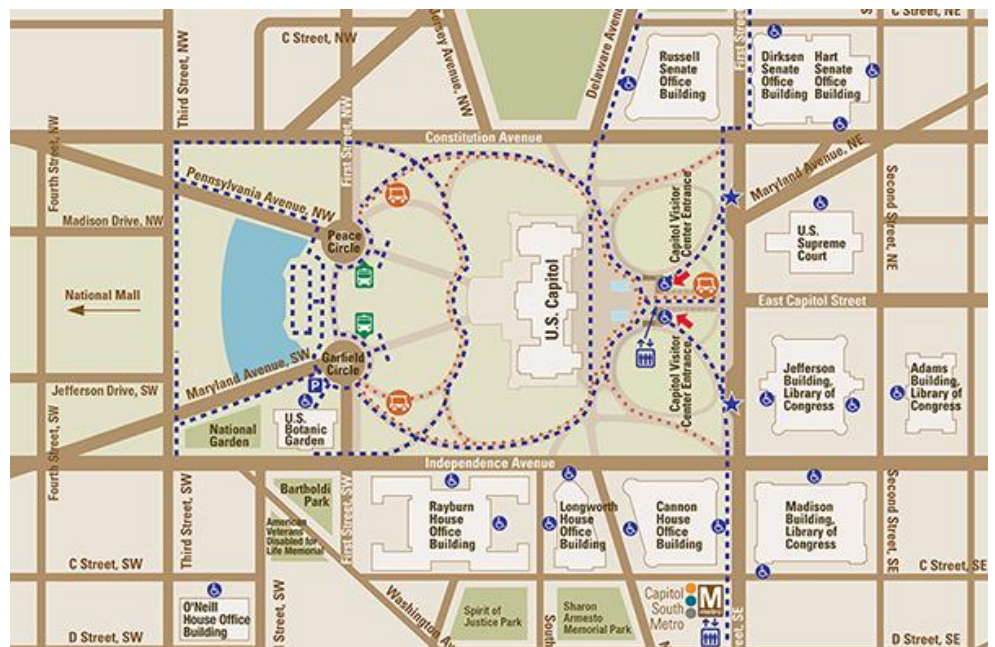


When you arrive at Union Station, get off the train and exit the station. Like the House, there are three Senate office buildings. Be sure to know where each meeting is being held. Hart and Dirksen are connected to each other on most floors. Additionally, there is a tunnel that connects all the buildings that can be accessed on either the ground floor or basement, depending on the building. Follow the signs and give yourself a 15-minute buffer for travel between meetings. The entrances to the Senate Office Buildings are identified by the accessibility logo.



Traveling between the House Office Buildings to the Senate Office Buildings

The best way to get from one side of Capitol Hill to the other is to walk. Take First St SE or use the pedestrian walkway right by the U.S. Capitol. The walk is about 10-15 minutes. You will have to go through a security screening when you re-enter the Senate or House Office Buildings.



Security Screenings

The House and Senate Office Buildings have airport-style security screenings for all visitors. As a rule of thumb, don't bring anything to the Capitol that you wouldn't bring to an airport. Additionally, you are prohibited from bringing in bags larger than 18" wide, 14" high and 8.5" deep. For additional information on prohibited items, read the full list at this link:
